

# Senior Tecumseh Boy Winners

Established in 1927, this award is given to the senior boy who, by vote of the senior campers, typifies the spirit of Camp Tecumseh with emphasis on manliness, service, loyalty, and leadership. A plaque donated by Ernest Scott (father of David R. who was Tecumseh Boy in 1954) with the names of all previous Tecumseh Boy winners is awarded and held by the winner for one year. Starting in 1988, the Senior Tecumseh Boy also received a \$2000 scholarship to an institution of higher learning from the \$35,000 bequest of Arthur F. Armstrong who was a counselor at Tecumseh in the 1920's and later Chairman of the Trustees from 1970 to 1979. Mr. Armstrong continued his enthusiasm for Tecumseh until his death on September 29, 1987. Armstrong's ashes were spread around camp at his request.

# Junior Tecumseh Boy Winners

Beginning in 1936, the Kenneth H. Bitting Trophy was given in the form of a large bowl inscribed with the winners' names. This is awarded annually to the camper in the junior divisions, who, in the opinion of his fellow campers, was most outstanding for his courtesy, his manliness, and his service to the camp. At the time the award was established, it was awarded to any boy below senior age, including intermediates. Since 1983, with the beginning of the Alvin S. Wagner Intermediate Award, only boys below Intermediate age were eligible and the method of election modified. Each Junior cabin nominates one boy. The entire counsel then makes the final selection from those nominated. Kenneth H. Bitting donated the trophy because of his early experience at Tecumseh in 1915 and his desire to foster Tecumseh ideals. He served with distinction in both World War I and World War II. His son Kenneth H. Bitting, Jr. was at Tecumseh, starting in 1936.

# Time Line Of New Programs And Events

Below is a chronological list of significant changes and additions at Camp Tecumseh during the last 50 years of camp. Some of the years may be a little bit off.

1952 - Tecumseh's 50th Anniversary Reunion is held on February 29. At that time, the Board of Trustees announce the appointment of George Munger as the new Director of Camp Tecumseh. Previous Director Al Wagner stays at Tecumseh as Associate Director through 1962.

1952 - Munger introduces the new idea of "Clinic" to prepare campers and counselors for the upcoming athletic season. In the early years, the instruction part of clinic was limited to football. Soon after, soccer was added. Over time, numerous other sports would be added.

1953 - The corn fields are converted to a new athletic field and named "Grant Field."

1953 - Water-skiing is introduced at Tecumseh.

1953 - Electronic refrigeration comes to the Tecumseh kitchen. Previously, refrigeration was accomplished by cutting large blocks of ice from the lake every winter.

1954 - Under the direction of Tom Fraser, a beautiful new putting green is developed at the waterfront.

1956 - Lajos "Maestro" Csiszar arrives at Tecumseh and introduces the sport of fencing.

1960 - A new Opera House is built for the Annual Gilbert and Sullivan production, along with many other events. The facility would later be named "The Henry B. Williams Opera House."

1962 - A new wing is added to the Dining Hall. Two new cabins are added to the Junior Campus.

1968 - Two new tennis courts are built. Courts 7 and 8 are built up the hill from courts 5 and 6.

1968 - The Mack's Shack becomes the newest cabin on the Junior Campus. The seven cabins on the Junior Campus in 1968 are the exact same cabins in use in 2002.

1974 - The Sunbeam Shack is removed and replaced by a set of showers. The old "Counselors Shack" is renamed "The Sunbeam Shack." A new Counselor Shack is built behind the basketball courts so that counselors could enjoy late night activities away from the campers.

1975 - A new Widdow is built with four times as many seats. People no longer have to rub knees with the person next to them. Unfortunately, the view wasn't so good. The new Widdow is set up so that one section can be blocked off for women only during dances and Parents Weekend.

1976 - A new dock is built. The new dock was designed to have people swim on the left side. Previously, everyone swam on the right side of the dock.

1976 - The Lodge goes through major renovations, including significant structural reinforcement. On the inside, plaques are left where they were. The office area is overhauled and made much nicer.

1976 - George Munger finishes his last summer as Director at Tecumseh. Senior staff members Ed Lawless and Al Molloy also retire from Tecumseh. Don McBride takes over as Director of Tecumseh in 1977.

1978 - Tecumseh builds a new large cabin for George Munger. Munger retired as Camp Director after the 1976 season, but continued going to Tecumseh and helping out every summer until his death in 1994.

1979 - A new pitching machine and batting cage are set up to the side of the Trunk Room.

1979 - A winter snowstorm causes the roof of the Intermediate Cabin to collapse. As a result, two new intermediate cabins are built on the other side of camp. The cabins are named "The House Of George" and "Pinky's Pad," in honor of George Munger and Pinky Shover.

1979 - The Mini-Marathon makes its debut at Tecumseh. The winner was Joe Gorman (25:58), followed by Rob Allman, Larry Saul (top camper), Hart Baur and Camp Director Don McBride, who clocked in at 27:09.

1982 - An addition is made to the Lookout cabin to hold more campers.

1984 - Richard Roe becomes Director of Camp Tecumseh, after Don McBride retires.

1984 - A second basketball court is added to fulfill the huge demand for basketball at Tecumseh.

1985 - A new cabin is added to house the Camp Director and his family. The new cabin is located just past the Fraser, Glascott and Cooper cottages. The new cabin is nicknamed "The Palace."

1985 - A new weight lifting facility is added down at the waterfront, thanks to a generous donation from former camper and counselor Lew Smith.

1986 - The ski jump is removed for insurance reasons. The wood was later used to make a soccer backboard.

1986 - A new state-of-the-art tennis surface replaces the old dirt courts.

1986 - Glascott Hall is built, located near the infirmary, the showers and the Sunbeam Shack. Glascott Hall is declared off-limits to campers. The building includes a pool table, television, VCR and telephone.

1988 - A regulation size beach volleyball court is built down at the waterfront.

1994 - The horse program is discontinued for financial reasons as well as a declining interest in horses.

1994 - By command of the State of New Hampshire, nude swimming is banned. This ended the "bathing suits optional" tradition that had lasted over 90 years at Tecumseh. A few years later, the Tecumseh dock becomes co-ed. Eventually female waterfront counselors become the norm on the dock.

1994 - The Counselor Shack is closed down forever. It is remade into an equipment and tool storage facility.

1996 - Hench Murray becomes Director of Camp Tecumseh, after Richard Roe retires.

1996 - *The Camp Tecumseh Newsletter* is created by Lee Allman. This yearly publication is sent out to Tecumseh alumni. The newsletter would soon be renamed *The Blue-Gray Banner*. Lee Allman came up with the idea for the newsletter. Lee was the original editor while Bill Keffer and Edwin Van Dusen helped produce it.

1998 - The Camp Tecumseh web site goes online: [www.camptecumseh.net](http://www.camptecumseh.net)

1998 - An even newer, state-of-the-art weight lifting facility is built down at the waterfront.

1999 - Stanley Field replaces the horse ring in front of the Farm House. Stanley Field was built to fulfill the huge demand for lacrosse. Stanley Field was made possible by a generous donation from the Stanley family.

1999 - The rifle range is converted into an archery range.

1999 - Lights are added to the basketball courts.

2000 - A new building is erected near the basketball courts. Originally called "Jay Luff's Shack," it soon becomes known as the Creamery.

2000 - The Bill Weaver Track and Field area is developed, thanks to a donation from Bill Weaver, a former camper and counselor back in the late 1920's.

2000 - A new roller hockey area is added. The rink is located in deep left-center field of the Junior Baseball Diamond. Future plans might include putting a roof over the rink, so that rainy day activities can be played there.

2001 - Jim Talbot becomes Director of Camp Tecumseh, after Hench Murray retires.

2001 - Pemi Day changes format slightly. Outside officials, referees and umpires were hired to officiate all events. This proves to be an excellent idea as each camp could not longer accuse the other of biased officiating.

2002 - In order to meet the growing number of married couples at Tecumseh, two new family cabins are built near the Fraser, Glascott and Cooper cabins. Pete and Katie Gillin, along with Charlie and Heather Erwin are the first tenants in the new cabins.

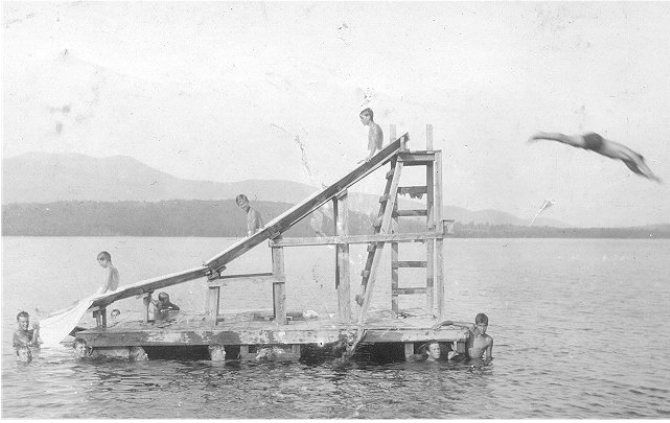

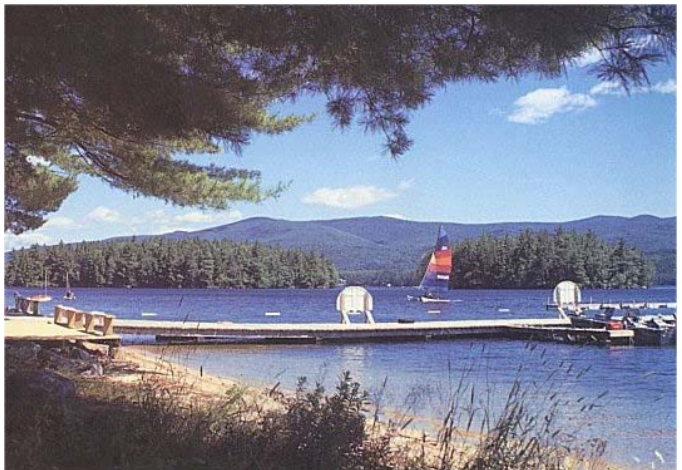

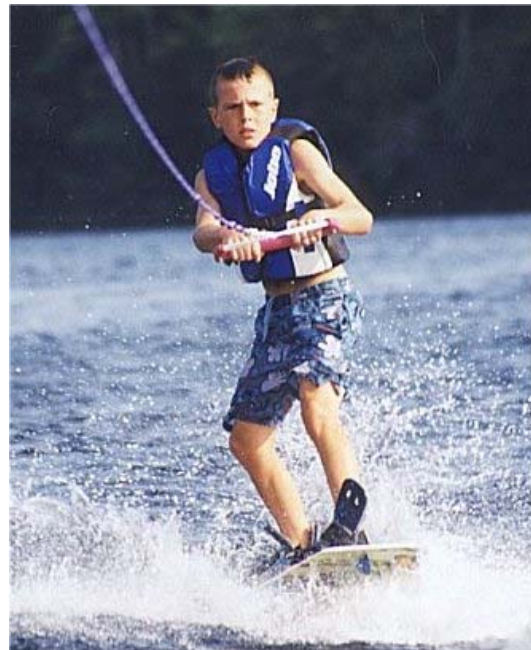
